Grammar Reference

An object pronoun is used as the object of a verb, and it usually stands after the verb.

For example:

She can see **me**.

She doesn't like **him**.

Here are the subject pronouns and their object pronouns:

Subject Pronouns	Object Pronouns
I	me
you	you
he	him
she	her
it	it
we	us
they	them



“like” and “don't like”

“Like” is used to show what we enjoy.

“Don't like” is used to show what we don't enjoy.

Examples:

- She likes fried rice.
- He doesn't like fried noodles.
- We don't like vegetables.

 like (+ noun)	I like You like We like They like He likes She likes It likes	vegetables.
 don't like (+noun)	I don't like You don't like We don't like They don't like He doesn't like She doesn't like It doesn't like	fish.

Note: *don't like* = do not like
doesn't like = does not like
