Grammar Reference

An object pronoun is used as the object of a verb, and it usually stands after the verb.

For example:

anaieus apras

STRA UN

She can see **me**.

She doesn't like **him**.

Here are the subject pronouns and their object pronouns:

Subject Pronouns	Object Pronouns
Ι	me
you	you
he	him
she	her
it	it
we	us
they	them

"like" and "don't like"

"Like" is used to show what we enjoy.

"Don't like" is used to show what we don't enjoy.

Examples:

- She likes fried rice.
- He doesn't like fried noodles.
- We don't like vegetables.

	You like	
	We like	
	They like	vegetables.
like (+ noun)	He likes	
	She likes	
	It likes	
	I don't like	
000	You don't like	
80	We don't like	
don't like	They don't like	fish.
(+noun)	He doesn't like	
	She doesn't like	
	It doesn't like	

Note: *don't like* = do not like

doesn't like = does not like
