Question with the verb "do"

The word "do" or "does" as an auxiliary verb is used with a main verb when forming a question or a negative sentence in present tense. Example:

I don't live with my parents.

He doesn't like to eat pizza.

Do you want to visit the U.S.?

Does she play football every day?

Question form:

Do/Does + subject + verb (base form) + ... +?

Example:

Short answer

Do you have a TV in your bedroom?

Yes, I do. / No, I don't.

Does your house have a dining room?

Yes, it

does/ No, it doesn't.

Do/Does	subject	verb (base form)	***
Do	I/you/we/they	like	vegetables?
Does	he/she/it	drink	coffee?

Negative form:

Subject + does/do + not + verb (base form) ...

Example:

They do not have breakfast.

Lisa's house does not have a garden.

I/You/We/They	do not (don't)	have	breakfast on Mondays.
He/She/It	does not (doesn't)	read	books on weekends.
