WH-question “who”

WH-question “who” is used to ask about a person.

Example:

Who is our teacher?
Mr. Joe is our teacher.

Who can meet and greet visitors?
The receptionist!

“Can”

We use “can” to talk about something is possible or allowed or that someone has the ability to do something.

Example:

We **can see** our school from here.
I **can speak** English.
I **can come** and **see** you tomorrow.

Form:

Subject + can + verb (base form) + ...

Negative form:

Subject + can't / (cannot) + verb (base form) + ...

Example:

I **can't cook**.
She **can't dance**.

Question form:

Can + subject + verb (base form) + ...?

Example:

Can you cook?
Yes, I can.
No, I can't.

Can he sing?
No, he can't.
Yes, he can.
