Grammar Reference

Singular and Plural Nouns

Rule 1: Add "S" to a singular noun to make it plural.

singularplurala cattwo catsa bookthree booksa dogten dogs

Rule 2: Add "es" to singular nouns ending with "ch, sh, x, o, ss".

a watch
a brush
2 brushes
one box
one class
a tomato
two tomatoes

Rule 3: Nouns that don't follow Rule 1 or 2 are irregular nouns.

a child two child<u>ren</u>
a man four m<u>e</u>n
a woman three wom<u>e</u>n
a person seven people

There is/There are: to say that something exists or happens

There is + singular nouns.

Example: There is a dog in the house.

There are + plural nouns.

Example: There are <u>three cats</u> in the house.

There isn't/ There aren't: to say that something doesn't exist or happen

Example: There isn't any water in the cup. **Example:** There aren't any boys in the class.

<u>Is there</u>/ Are there: to ask whether or not something exists or <u>happens</u>

Example:

Is there any water in the cup? Yes, there is. / No, there isn't.

Example:

Are there any students in the class? Yes, there are. / No, there aren't.
