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## Grammar Reference

Three possible ways to describe people's appearance:

### 1. Using adjectives: Subject + to be + adjective

*Example:* -She is **pretty**.  
-They are **old**.

### 2. Using adjectives + nouns: subject + have/has + adjective + noun

*Example:* -He has **straight hair**.  
-They have **blue eyes**.

### 3. Talking about clothes: subject + to be + wearing + (adjective) clothes

*Example:* -I am wearing a **white T-shirt**.  
-She is wearing a **black shirt and blue jeans**.

## “Look like”

A question with “look like” is used to ask about somebody's appearance.

Example:

What does David **look like**?  
He's tall. He has dark hair, and he's wearing a white T-shirt.

**Form:**

**What + does/do + subject + look like?**

**Note:**

**Who** does David look like? (Ask about his similarity with another person)

He **looks like** his grandfather Ben.
