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Grammar Reference

OBJECT PRONOUNS

Use: An “object pronoun” is used as the object of a verb or preposition.

Example:

Lisa has three kittens. She loves **them** very much. (“**them**” is the object of the verb “**love**”)

He is sitting next to **her**. (“**her**” is the object of the preposition “**next to**”)

Here are the object pronouns in English language:

Subject Pronouns	Object pronouns
I	me
he	him
she	her
it	it
we	us
you	you
they	them

Form:

Subject + verb + object pronoun

preposition + object pronoun

They love **me**. NOT They love **I**.

We talked to **them** yesterday. NOT We talked to **they** yesterday.

Demonstratives ‘this’, ‘that’, ‘those’, and ‘these’

Use:

Use “this” for one object (singular) that is here (near us).

Example:

This neighborhood is beautiful.

Use “these” for two or more objects (plural) that are near us.

Example:

These books are good for elementary students.

Use “that” for one object (singular) that is there (far from us).

Example:

That flower is beautiful.

Use “those” for two or more objects (plural) that are far from us.

Example:

Those stars look beautiful.
