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## Grammar Reference

### Grammar focus:

#### “WH-questions” “Would”

Use:  
There are seven WH-questions. Here’s what they are and how they are used.

We use “what” to ask about things or animals.

Example:

What is this?

What time is your appointment?

We use “who” to ask about a person or people.

Example:

Who are you talking to on the phone?

Who is your teacher?

We use “why” to ask about a reason.

Example:

Why were you late this morning?

Why did you call me last night?

We use “when” to ask about the time period in which something happens.

Example:

When did you start learning English?

When did you receive the call?

We use “which” to ask about choices or a comparison between two or more similar things.

Example:

Which apple do you prefer?

Which company do you work for, CK or LV?

We use “where” to ask about the location of a person or thing.

Example:

Where do you work?

Where is the information desk?

We use “how” to ask about the way something happens or the way someone does something.

Example:

How do you make a phone call from Cambodia to America?

How can I get to the bus station?

### Questions with “Would”

We begin a question with “would” to ask people to do things or to make requests.

For example:

**Would** you **give** her this message? (Polite)

**Would** you **mind introducing** yourself? (More polite and formal)

Form:

Would + subject + verb (base form) + ...?

Would you mind + verb (-ing) + ....?
