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# **Grammar** Reference

## Past simple

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The past simple is generally used to talk about something that happened already and was finished in the past. Example:

I was at the theater yesterday.

We went fishing last weekend.

## Verb "to be"

Verb "is/am" is changed to "was". Verb "are" is changed to "were"

#### Form:

Subject + was/were + ...

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Example:
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He was tired last night.

#### Negative form:

Subject + was/were + not +  $\dots$ 

#### Example:

They were not at the library a few hours ago.

He wasn't in the classroom this morning.

#### Notes:

"wasn't" = "was not"

"weren't" = "were not"

# **Question form:**

Was/Were + subject + ...?

#### Example:

Were the singers good?Yes, they were. No, theyweren't.Was he there?Was he there?Yes, he was.No, he wasn't.

Subject + verb +  $\dots$ 

Example:

He visited his aunt yesterday.

# Negative form:

Subject + did + not (didn't) + verb (base form) +  $\dots$ 

Example:

They didn't play soccer last week.

# Yes/No question form:

Did + subject + verb (base form) + ... ?

# Example:

Did you watch a movie last night? Yes, I did. No, I didn't.

#### **Question form:**

Wh-word + did + subject + verb (base form) +  $\dots$ ?

## Example:

When did you wash the dishes?

1.	For most regular verbs, just add "-ed" to the verb

	listen	listened		
2.	Add "-d" to verbs that end in "-e"			
	live	lived		
	change	changed		
<mark>3.</mark>	With verbs that	With verbs that end in a consonant + "-y", change the "-y" to "-i" and		
	add "-ed"			

study	studied
carry	carried

4. With verbs of one syllable that end in a vowel + a consonant, double the consonant and add "-ed"

plan	planned
jog	jogged
